THE DISTRICT

Walnut Township Local School District is located in the northeast corner of Fairfield County near Buckeye Lake, approximately 30 miles from Columbus, Ohio. The district serves the village of Millersport, Fairfield Beach, and the surrounding Walnut Township area. The village of Millersport is a small community of approximately 1,200 residents. The school district consists of one junior-senior high school and one elementary school. At Christmas time the school district and community collaborate to sponsor "White Christmas", a project to collect and deliver food, clothing, and toys to senior citizens and local families in need.



THE SCHOOL

The current Millersport Junior-Senior High School (7-12) was built in 1975 and additions were constructed in 1986. Millersport Junior-Senior High School has an enrollment of 360 students and offers a comprehensive four-year program for students in grades 9-12. The school year consists of four nine-week quarters. The day is divided into nine 42-minute periods. The first semester ends January 15, 2010 and the second semester ends June 3, 2010.



THE FACULTY

Millersport Junior-Senior High School employees 34 staff members consisting of 24 certified teachers, 14 of whom hold at least a Master's Degree. The average number of years teaching experience is 14.



CURRICULUM

A variety of courses are offered to meet the needs of our student population. Courses range from Advanced Placement to developmental classes. Advanced Placement options for accelerated students are available in the following subjects during the 2009-2010 school year: AP English Literature & Composition, AP Calculus AB, and AP Biology. Additional AP courses are available through neighboring Liberty Union High School, if scheduling permits. Millersport Junior-Senior High School is accredited by the State of Ohio Department of Education.



STUDENT SERVICES

One school counselor assists students with personal, social, and academic concerns, college selections and career/vocational plans at Millersport Junior-Senior High School (7-12). Other support personnel and programs are available in our district through Fairfield County Educational Service Center, such as special education services.



PROGRAMS AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Millersport Junior-Senior High School students are highly involved in 9 varsity sports and 13 academic, music, and social organizations. Approximately 19 students participate in a two-year school-to-work, school-to-college programs offered by Fairfield-Eastland Career and Technical School District. These Career Centers also offer access to five satellite locations for juniors and seniors. Millersport Junior-Senior High School participates in Post-Secondary Educational Options Program in accordance with the Ohio Board of Education guidelines. This program allows high school students to earn college and high school credit through successful completion of college courses.



CLASS RANK

In averaging grades for class standing, all courses to which credit is assigned will be averaged. The valedictorian and salutatorian shall be determined on the basis of grades earned up to and including those of the last interim report of their senior year. To be considered for this status, one must be enrolled in the college preparation course of study that includes:

Class of 2010 graduates must pass all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test in Reading, Writing, Math, Citizenship and Science.
